Never operate mower deck lock nuts without chute deflector installed and harness on. Installing Dash Cap (if necessary): Secure steering wheel with hex bolt from under cap, torque to 18-22 ft./lbs. Install dash cap by lining up tabs and placing steering wheel cap over center of steering wheel. Installing Front Bumper (if necessary): Remove four hex screws from bumper. California Proposition 65 WARNING: Battery posts, terminals, and accessories contain lead and lead compounds. Checking Tire Pressure: Maintain equal pressure at all times. Refer to tire sidewall for proper pressure. Controls & Features: * Fuel Tank Cap * Throttle/Choke Hour Meter Control Lever * Ignition Module or Throttle Control Lever (if so equipped) * Forward Drive Pedal * Reverse Drive Pedal * PTO Switch (if so equipped) * Choke Control Brake Pedal * PTO Handle (if so equipped) * Park Brake/Cruise Control Lever * Deck Lift Lever Throttle/Choke Control Lever: Never leave a running machine unattended. Always disengage PTO, set parking brake, stop forward, and remove key to prevent... engine damage. Cub Connect enables location of Service Centers, access step-by-step instructions for routine maintenance, and purchase replacement parts. Reverse Caution Mode: The REVERSE CAUTION MODE will remain activated until the key is placed in either the NORMAL MOWING or STOP position. NOTE: Mowing in reverse is not recommended. Driving On Slopes Release When using your tractor's forward drive pedal, keep it in the down position after completing step 3. This will help maintain a consistent speed. Make sure you're familiar with the SLOPE GAUGE on page 8 to determine safe slopes for operation. To engage the PTO (Power Take-Off), slowly press the forward drive pedal until you reach your desired speed. Note that the tractor's speed can affect the quality of attachments, such as separately available cutting decks or other equipment. Regular maintenance is crucial for your tractor's optimal performance and longevity. Refer to the Maintenance Schedule: * Prior to each use: Check engine oil level, air filter for dirtiness, loose parts, and clean battery terminals. * Every 5 hours: Clean engine cooling fans from debris. * Every 10 hours: Grease all lubrication points. * Every 25 hours: Perform a maintenance check & clean the engine. * Every 50 hours: Check the transmission drive belt and replace it if necessary. * Every 100 hours: Change the oil. If your tractor creeps forward or rearward when neither pedal is depressed, contact a Cub Cadet dealer to adjust the neutral setting. To complete an oil change: 1. Run the engine for a short time to warm up the oil. 2. Proceed with the oil change as instructed in the manual. When cleaning the tractor, turn off the water supply and detach the hose coupler from the water port on your deck's surface. Wipe off any fuel or oil spills promptly. For 50" and 54" decks, there are two water ports; one on each side of the deck. To lower the front of the deck: 1. Loosen the outer nut. 2. Loosen (thread outward) the inner nut away from the front hanger bracket. See Figure 6-5. The wheels on your 50" and 54" decks are spherical shaped, with a grease fitting for lubrication. Measure the distance from the outside of the left blade tip to the ground, and from the outside of the right blade tip to the ground. If you've stored your engine between 30 and 90 days, treat it with a gasoline stabilizer like STA-BIL. If stored over 90 days, run the engine empty of fuel to prevent deterioration. To connect a discharged battery: 1. Connect positive (+) cable to the positive (+) post on the tractor's discharged battery. 2. Connect the other end of the cable to the positive (+) post on a jumper battery. See Page 27 for more information. When removing the cutting deck, slide the rod to the right and locate the bow-tie pin on the rear left side of the deck. Be careful not to damage the wire harness. To properly sharpen your cutting blades: 1. Remove equal amounts of metal from both ends along the cutting edges. 2. Use a 25°- to 30° angle, parallel to the trailing edge.
